Recounts-

Explore different types of recounts. Children to write diary entries of Mildred Hubble's first day at Cackle's Academy.

Persuasive Writing-

Explore the features of persuasive writing. Write a persuasive letter persuading the Dursleys to let Harry go to Hogwarts.

<u>Maths</u>

Number and place value-

Counting in multiplies of 6,7,9,25 and 1000. Find 1000 more or less than a number. Count backwards through zero. Recognise the place value in a 4 digit number. Round any number to nearest 10, 100 and 1000. Read Roman numerals.

Addition and Subtraction-

Add and subtract numbers with up to 4 digits using a written method. Estimate and use inverse to check answers. Solve a range of problems based on place value and addition and subtraction.

Science

States of Matter: Group materials based on their state of matter (solid, liquid, gas). Describe how some materials can change state. Explore how materials change state.
