Homework

- Home learning alternates between Maths (MyMaths) and English (Teams). It is set on a Thursday and due the following Wednesday.
- TT rockstars your child will have a set number of games each week – set Wednesday to Wednesday. This will change through the year as their tables improve
- Reading your child needs to be reading to an adult 3 x a week at home. Reading records checked on a Friday.

Please let us know if your child will have difficulty accessing the internet for homework. Homework club is run every day at lunchtime to support if required.

Multiplication Check

- Times Tables Rockstars
- Daily practice at home is key to securing tables
- At the end of Year 4 all pupils in the UK will complete a MTC (multiplication times check). This involves the children answering a set of 25 questions in which they have 6 seconds to answer. This is exactly the same as the soundcheck on TTRockstars.
- To pass, children need to score 25/25

Morning drop off


- For the safety of all children, it is crucial that children are not left unattended on the school site until 8:20am, when a member of staff will be present to open the school gate and welcome the children.
- If you need to drop your child off earlier than this time, we recommend arranging suitable supervision or for them to attend breakfast club until the school gate is opened.



Uniform expectations

- If they wear a shirt with a collar, they must be wearing a tie.
- School fleeces are only to be worn outside for playtime and PE (jumpers or cardigans inside please)
- Black school shoes must be worn with black or grey socks (or white socks or grey tights for girls) – no trainer socks please.
- School shirts must be tucked in when inside the school building.
- Hair should be tied or held back if it falls over the face (boys and girls); hair bands
 should be simple blue or black bands. Hair-gel and similar products are not permitted.
- Jewellery and nail polish should not be worn to school (apart from simple studs if ears are pierced which need to be removed for P.E/games and swimming).
- PE kit black shorts and school PE t-shirt with plain black/navy long bottoms and jumper for colder weather.
