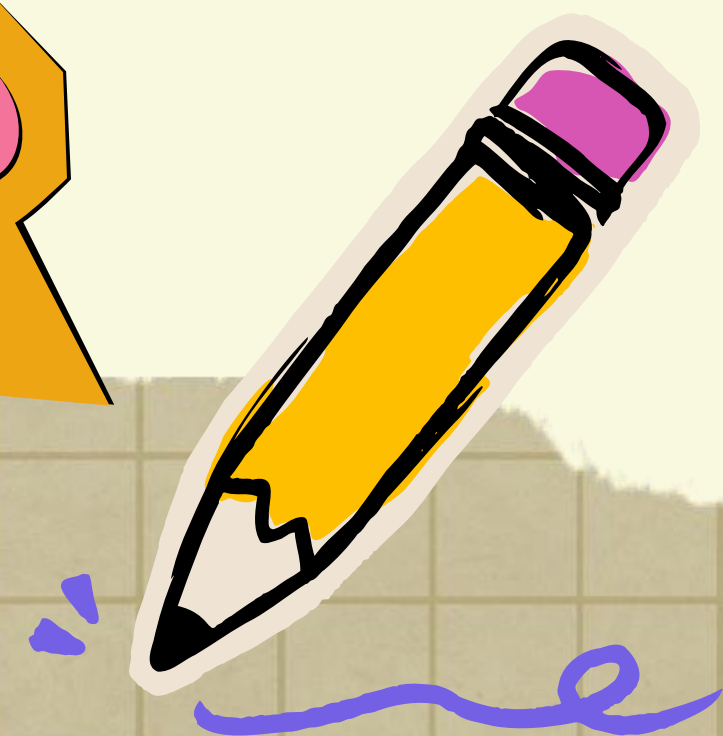

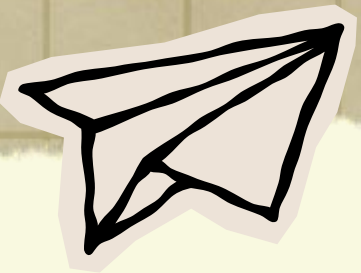

These are checked regularly, however please do ensure your child knows that there is a message so that they can let an adult know.

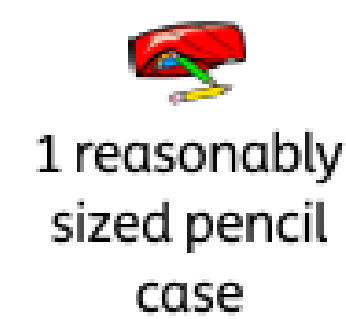
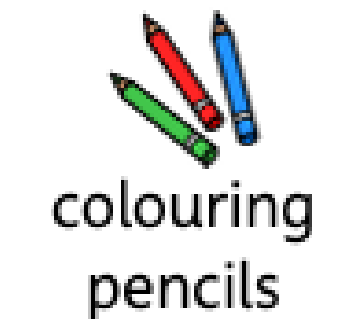
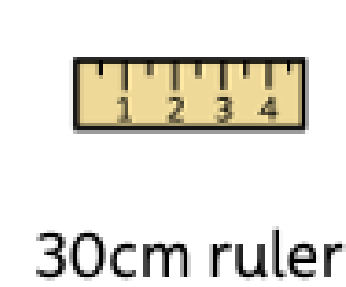
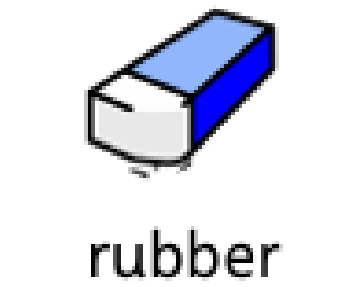
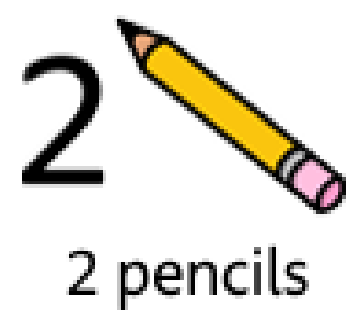

Children should bring only the required items to avoid any additional distractions.

It is important that children have the correct equipment each day to ensure they do not lose any learning time gathering equipment.

This allows them to prepare further for their future years.

Some key reminders:

- A shirt with a collar requires a tie
- After half term, all children will be in winter uniform- shirt and a tie
- School fleeces are only to be worn outside for playtime and PE
- Black school shoes must be worn with black/grey socks (or tights)- no trainer socks please (Girl's summer dress can be worn with white socks)
- PE kit: plain black shorts/trousers, a school PE t-shirt, school hoodie (or plain royal blue hoodie), white unbranded socks.

Uniform

This item belongs to:

- School shirts must be tucked in when inside the school building.
- Hair should be tied back if possible or held back if it falls over the face; hair bands should be simple blue or black bands.
- Jewellery and nail polish should not be worn to school (apart from simple studs which need to be removed for P.E/games and swimming).
- No watches with functions other than a pedometer are permitted. Watches must be removed for P.E/games.
- Please ensure your child has a waterproof coat in school with arms and a hood every day.
- Please ensure all uniform is NAMED!

Each day, your child should bring...

- * Pencil case
- * Water bottle
- * Reading book and record
- * Library book
- * Home contact book
- * Waterproof coat when needed (We go out in all weather)

You may also send a break time snack- no crisps, chocolate, sweets or nuts/nut containing items

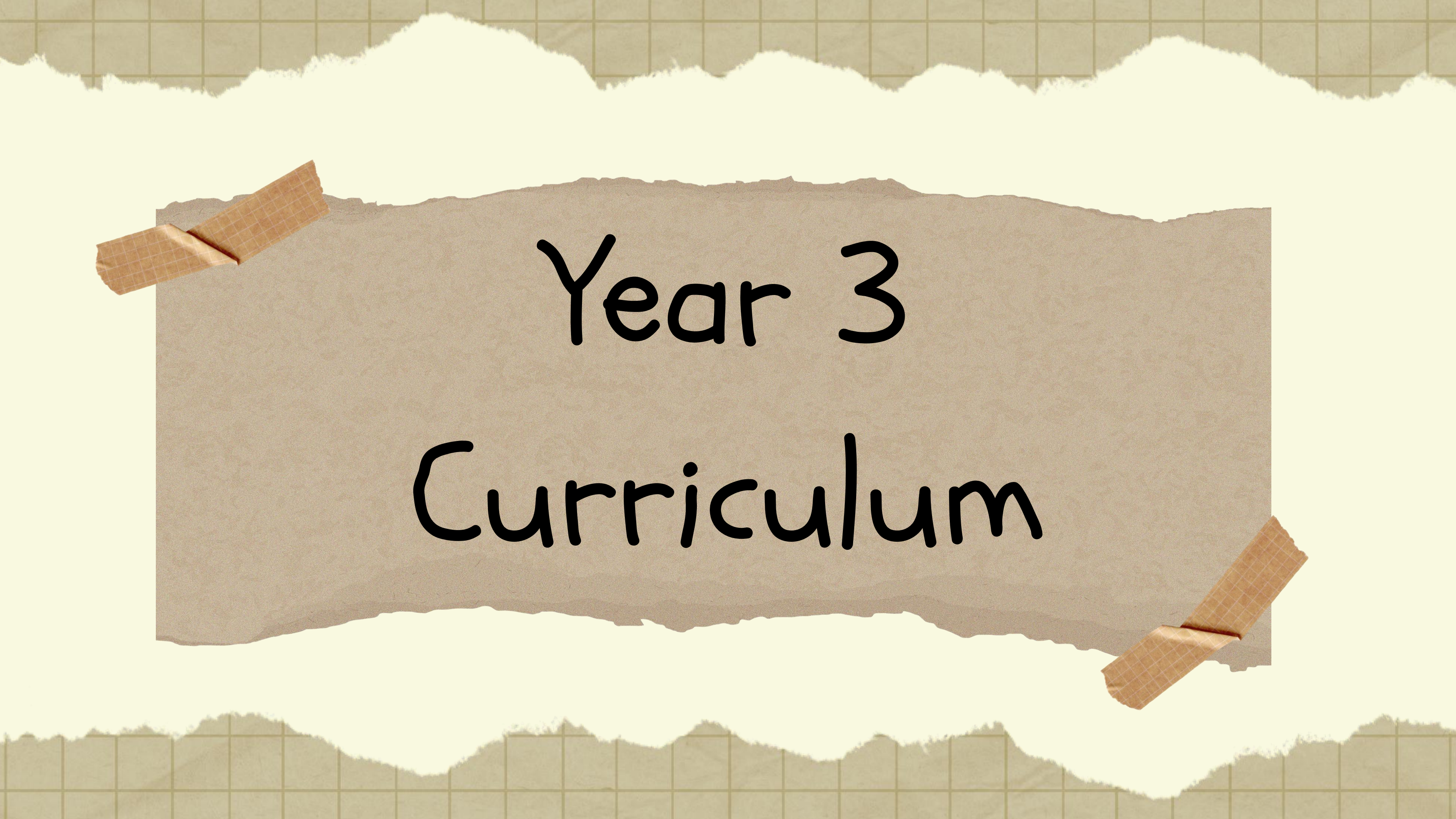

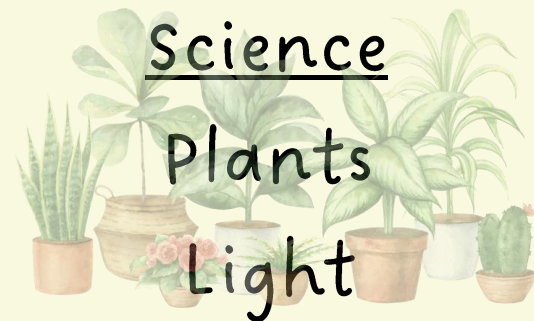

We love learning outside!

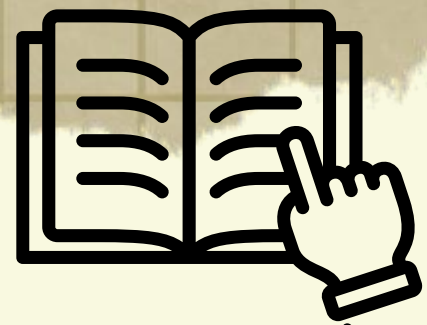
Classes will have a fortnightly forest school session.

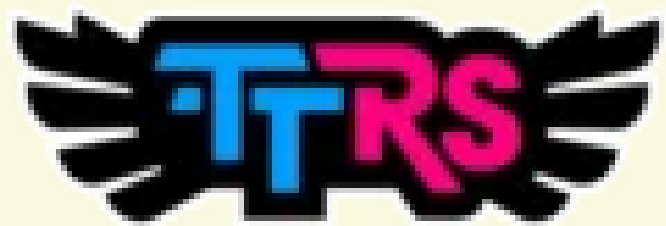
Homework

- Walking to church/local area walks throughout the year

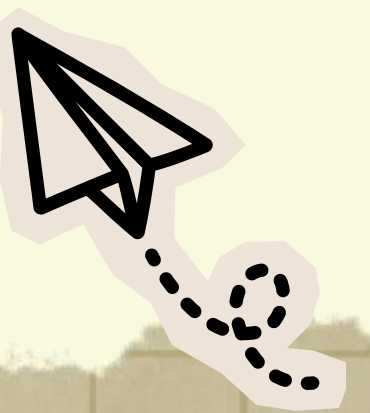
To volunteer regularly, such as parent reading, a DBS is needed. These are organised via the school office.
