Next week's worship theme – Forgiveness

This week we have been considering 'being fair' in our collective worship, starting off with us discussing how it would feel if only children with brown eyes were allowed to use the equipment/ trim trail. The sense of injustice in the hall was palpable. Today, we have further reflected on the theme as we mark 'show racism the red card' day. We listened to several footballers including Thierry Henry, talk about how they faced racism in their sport and how this made them feel. Nelson Mandella once said, 'Education is the most powerful weapon you can use to change the world'. Change starts with us.

Although it already seems an age ago, we were very proud to show off our school during our OFSTED inspection last week. Thank you for your part in the parent survey too. I am very much looking forward to sharing the report when it is out next half term.

Over the past few weeks, Year 5 have been learning about space and visited the planetarium as part of this. Today I have also been privy to an interesting debate about colonising Mars, with some very persuasive perspectives on both sides.

Year 4 have been exploring the Winchester Science Museum today, as part of their science unit. I have also seen them working hard in maths, deciding the most efficient strategies for subtraction too. Year 6 have also been working hard in maths this week, exploring the concept of BODMAS. I was impressed with their grasp of this so very early in the term. Year 3 are continuing to invent their own fairy stories, using some traditional tales and fairy stories as their inspiration. It was lovely to hear some of these read aloud in class when I was there – the children were so expressive!

Once again, may I ask parents politely to try wherever possible to turn left at the exit gates at the start and end of the day. Whilst it may appear to add a few minutes onto the journey, I am convinced it will save at least that in the time spent queuing. Thank you for your co-operation here.


