As we well know, the final weeks before Christmas are some of the busiest in the calendar and there is no exception to this at Waverley Abbey. The Christmas performance from Year 5 was utterly brilliant and I am in no doubt that Year 3 will be equally strong next week too. The Year 5 children were able to project their voices well, sing like angels and also show their bravery by being on stage in front of such a large audience. It was also wonderful to see them grow in confidence throughout the rehearsals and into performance night. Even though we are a large school, I have a great sense of pride that all of our children, (who want to) are able to be on stage and perform. My thanks to our Year 3 and 5 staff teams who continue to bring out the best in each and every performer and also to parents who have prepped costumes and supported throughout.

This week has also been packed full of learning. I have had the pleasure of watching Year 6 consider the complex character that is Lady Macbeth. Their writing this week has been truly stunning. Year 5 have been perfecting their fractions in maths. I was particularly proud of a group of boys who came to show me their learning earlier on in the week as they had openly admitted to struggling when this was first taught. However, they had persevered and were now confidently able to explain the strategy – a real lightbulb moment! Geography has been a focus in Year 4 with the children learning about volcanoes and earthquakes as well as being in a 'real' Japanese earthquake at the Natural History Museum on Monday. In Year 3 the children have been mastering some complex

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computing, focussing on programming using Scratch their debugging skills are very impressive.

I am very much looking forward to being part of church services next week too as well as watching the Year 4 service on Thursday, which was lovely. Parents are warmwelcomed to join us for these services (see separate Year group letters). While all the festivities happen, there is still a strong focus on our curriculum and squeezing every learning opportunity into the final week as well staff and children certainly do not get bored!
