

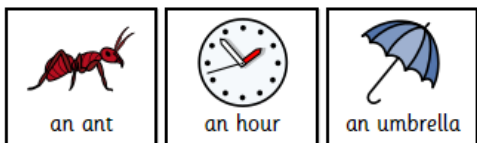

Key words, definitions and examples

Preposition—words that are used to show **position, place, direction** or **time**.

Conjunction—a word that joins parts of a sentence together.

Clause—a group of words that contains a subject and a verb.

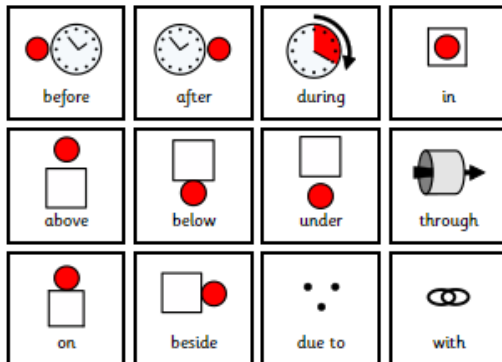
Subordinate clause— a clause which adds more information to a sentence and starts with a subordinating conjunction.

Direct speech—a way of reporting spoken text that quotes the exact words of the speaker.

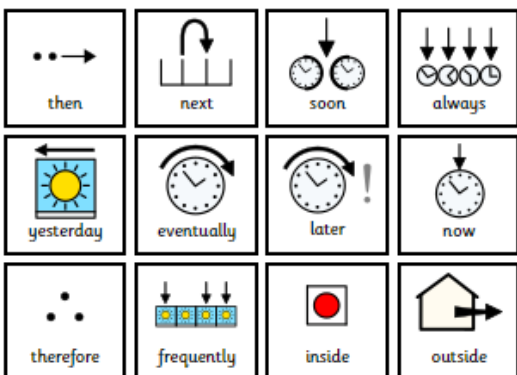
Inverted commas—a punctuation mark which is used around the words in direct speech.

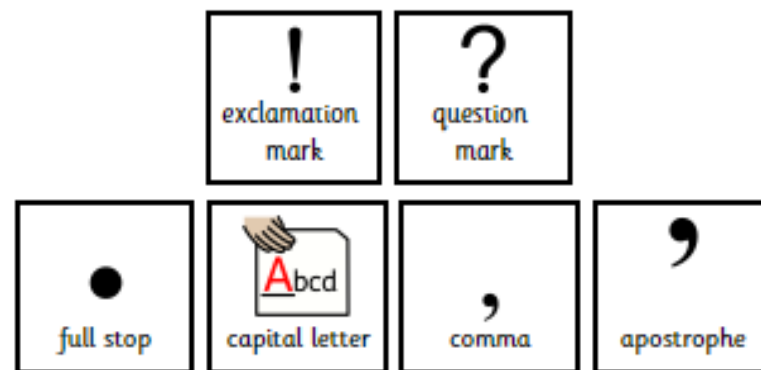
