**Mission Statement:**

Through the employment of a full time, qualified PE teacher as a member of the Waverley Abbey teaching staff, the impact has been as follows:

- High quality teaching of PE & Games during timetabled lessons
- A broad range of extra-curricular sporting opportunities both for our own pupils and for those of other local schools
- Increased pupil involvement in and responsibility for the organisation and running of sport based activities
- To continue to empower class teachers to deliver high quality teaching of Games throughout timetabled lessons through continued pdp training
- A model which is sustainable into the future.

Waverley Abbey is a school which has always had a reputation for sporting excellence in the local area and for providing an environment where as many pupils as possible are encouraged to participate in and appreciate the benefits of sport, in living a healthy lifestyle. We believe the employment of a specialist teacher has enhanced this further with increased number of pupils participating in sporting activities within school as well as an increase in sporting achievements within our Farnham district.

**Specific Initiatives which were planned and carried out for 2018-2019**

- Innovative curriculum for PE; orienteering, gymnastics and dance (employing a trained specialist enables pupils to have access to equipment which would not be possible if taught by their own class teacher, particularly in gymnastics)
- Swimming curriculum which takes our pupils far beyond the requirements of the National Curriculum. Support is given to ensure that all pupils are able to swim the required 25m by the end of the key stage
- The involvement and use of ICT in PE and Games to help improve technique/performance with pupils leading on this
- INSET training for all teaching staff, led by our P.E. specialist, based on the need of the class teachers which was ascertained through research
- Continuing to provide links of local clubs for children to engage in Sport outside of school
- Specialist coaches have been invited in to provide workshops for all pupils at WA such as Squash with other coaches (Cricket, Tennis) to be invited in

### **Pupils as Sports Leaders:**

- helping to run key sporting events in the school calendar e.g. area tournaments, sports day, Year 2 sports morning for local infant schools and swimming galas
- marshalling at internal sporting events e.g. whole school cross country
- Act as play leaders, organising activities and equipment on a regular basis during break and lunchtimes
- helping to run their own internal clubs (competitive/informal) for our younger pupils during lunchtimes
- umpiring and refereeing games
- Leading sections of PE/Games lessons

### **Extra-curricular Opportunities:**

- enabling WA to take a lead in the provision of local sporting events e.g. Farnham District Schools Football League
- provide a wide range of opportunities for increasing numbers of pupils to represent their school in sport - in a range of local leagues and tournaments, in friendly matches and in the creation of 'B' and 'C' team opportunities
- running extra-curricular clubs for Lacrosse, Parkour, Golf, Basketball, Dodgeball, Tchoukball, Breakdancing which are in addition to our usual provision of Netball, Football, Rugby, Hockey, Rounders, Cricket and Athletics
- hosting some of the 'big' local events e.g. The Borelli Cup, to enable some pupils to play sport whilst others gain practical experience of and an insight into how these events are run and organised
- Regularly investigating the uptake by pupils of internal clubs with the aim of achieving even greater pupil participation by providing clubs tailored to their particular interests e.g. fitness club, parkour, golf.

Waverley Abbey has again achieved Sainsbury's Gold Mark Award for 2017-2018 – This is now the fourth consecutive year this has been achieved. This scheme rewards schools for their commitment to and development of competition, participation level of sporting activities, school sport and physical education and recognises that the provision for PE is of a high consistent standard here at

Waverley Abbey. Ofsted can use this Mark to inform part of their inspection of PE in schools. Waverley Abbey will look to be the first in the area to try and achieve Platinum this year.

### **Swimming at Waverley Abbey**

At Waverley Abbey Swimming is a part of our school culture as we have a pool on site. All children swim at the beginning of the academic year up until the October half term and then for all of the summer term. As a result of this we are able to consistently meet the government's directive that all children leaving Waverley Abbey in Year 6 are able to Swim 25metres and given the platform to demonstrate water survival and safe rescue.

In the academic year of 2018-19 we forecast that 100% of our Year 6 cohort who were able to swim 25metres and perform a variety of safe rescue practices at the end of the academic year. During our autumn swimming we are able to target our Year 3's early on who need additional support with their swimming and work together with parents to ensure the necessary interventions are in place to ensure that they are able to make progress in swimming throughout their life at Waverley Abbey.

This academic year we currently have 7 children who are non-swimmers in Year 3. We are currently working with parents to ensure that they are supported to help develop their swimming from now until the summer term.

We envisage that all our current Year 6 pupils will be able to perform a variety of safe water rescues as well swim 25metres by the end of our current academic year.
